







of FDI in Ukraine's transport and logistics, 2023 in relation to investment in other types of economic activities


#### FDI stock in transport and logistics (selected), USD bln\*\*










**International Transport Corridors Crossing Ukraine** 

Ukraine's geographic location makes it an important transit corridor for trade and travel between Europe, Asia and the Middle East

When combined with its other comparative advantages, Ukraine has a potential to become an exclusive Eurasian hub

# In 2022 Ukrainian logistics routes were included in Trans-European Transport Network (TEN-T)


- The North Baltic Corridor was extended through Lviv and Kyiv to Mariupol





#### Maritime infrastructure state and development







In August 2023, due to the success of the Ukrainian Armed Forces, Ukraine managed to open a **new sea route through the Black Sea** for merchant ships, expanding the range of goods compared to the grain corridor, which ceased to function



75 mln t of cargo have been handled by the ports of Greater Odesa since the launch of the Ukrainian Sea Corridor, which serves about 50 countries as of Q3 2024


Since March 15, 2024, the Ukrainian corridor passing through the ports of Greater Odesa has been operating **around the clock**, which has increased exports of agricultural and other products **by 20%**





- \*\* The list and quantity of equipment are approved by the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine for each project.
- \*\*\* No earlier than 18 months before a date of submission of the application to the Authorised Body, the Applicant may contribute Significant Investments in objects of investments(CAPEX) in an amount not exceeding 30% of the total amount of Significant Investments required for the implementation of the Investment Project with Significant Investments.

# INVESTMENT INCENTIVES

The implementation of investment projects on the territory of industrial parks does not exclude the opportunity to receive additional incentives, in particular, provided for by the Law of Ukraine "On State Support for Investment Projects with Significant Investments" or the legal regime of Diia.City.

non-refundable financing for arranging an industrial park and/or construction of related infrastructure facilities\* up to UAH 150 million\*\*


